Who can enter?

Any undergraduate student enrolled at the Faculty of Medicine and Health Sciences except members of the Q committee. Students must enter either individually or in pairs of two. You can enter as many clips as you like, but the same student cannot win more than one prize per category.

Your Task:

Create a short video / multimedia clip on any concept relating to EBHC.

The clip should:

- Be in Afrikaans or English;
- Explain any single term relating to EBHC (including epidemiology and biostatistics concepts). Only 1 term should be explained per video clip;
- Be scientific, yet original and creative;
- Not be longer than 7 minutes;
- Be original and created by you. You should respect the intellectual property of others and only use any copyrighted material in your clip for which you have permission; and
- Not contain any material that may be offensive to others, against the law or liable to harm the reputation of the University in any way.

Subject to the above, you may use any method of producing your clip and you may include any material in your clip that you like.

A panel of judges skilled in EBHC will review entries and assess them based on the skill, ability and effort involved in producing the clips. In particular, clips will be assessed based on:

1. How well the chosen concept is explained; and
2. Creativity.

Submission:

Clips must be submitted in electronic format in any one of the popular video formats (MPG, AVI, WMV, MOV, RM, MKV etc).

Each video must be labelled with the words "EBHC Video, Name Surname and Student Number."
