*In Ancient Cultures 114, we read some of the oldest stories in the world: the epic of the Mesopotamian king, Gilgamesh, and Egyptian short stories. How did people live and think in those long-forgotten days – people who were both different from us, and offer a perspective on the human condition with all its questions and challenges?*

### Not just dead, white men

Texts and material objects are excellent tools for understanding something of the way people live, think, love, fight and deal with being human. In *Ancient Cultures 144*, we take a journey through Homer's *Odyssey* and the ruins of Pompeii to meet and understand the ancient Greeks and Romans – and ourselves – in all their/our diversity.

*In Classical (Ancient) Legal Culture 114 and 144 you will be introduced to the development of legal systems from as early as 3000 BCE to contemporary South Africa. This course is aimed at Law students and leads to further studies in Ancient Cultures.*

## ANTIEKE KULTURE

*In Antieke Kulture 114 lees ons die oudste stories in die wêreld: die epos van die Mesopotamiese koning Gilgamesj en Egiptiese kortverhale. Hoe het mense geleef en gedink in vervloë dae, wat wel anders as ons is, maar 'n perspektief bied op menswees met al sy vrae en uitdagings?*

### Nie net dooie, wit ooms nie

Tekste en materiële voorwerpe kan ons help om te verstaan hoe mense lewe, dink, lief het, baklei en met hulle eie menswees omgaan.
